I. GENERAL RULES ON ADMISSION

A. Admission to Pre-school

1. Age Requirements

Incoming Kindergarten must strictly comply with the cut-off age policy stated in DO No. 47, s. 2016, as amended by the DepEd Order.

Age qualification for kindergarten learners in both public and private schools should be five (5) years old by June 1 of every calendar year. However, the school may consider learners entering Kindergarten who will turn five (5) years old by the end of August on the condition that the Philippine Early Childhood Development (ECD) Checklist must be administered to the learner prior to the start of the opening of the school year, to ensure that the learner is capable of meeting the expectations of the grade level.

2. Other Requirements

- a. Birth Certificate (NSO)
- b. Accomplished Enrolment Form
- c. Entrance Examination Fee for Transferees

The schedule for examination is given at the time of the application.

B. Admission to Other Year Levels

1. Accomplished Enrolment Form
2. Report Card (Form 138)
3. Birth Certificate (NSO)
4. For transferees:
 - Entrance Examination Fee
 - Certificate of Good Moral Character from the previous school

*In case an applicant fails the entrance examination, he will be recommended to take remedial/summer classes.

*The school reserves the right to refuse admission to any student/pupil who does not meet the above requirements.

C. Fees and Payments

1. Tuition, miscellaneous and other fees are posted at the Business Office prior to and during the enrolment period.
2. All financial matters and payments of the same are settled in the Business Office.
3. A student / pupil shall not be considered officially enrolled and a bona fide student / pupil unless he has submitted his complete credentials and has paid the required tuition and miscellaneous fees upon enrolment.

D. Policies on Withdrawals

1. The registration fee is nonrefundable in any case. If the withdrawal occurs before the start of the classes, a penalty fee of P 1,000.00 will be imposed.
2. If the withdrawal occurs at the start (or thereafter) of the classes, the following will be imposed:
 - a. No refund on all miscellaneous fees;
 - b. No refund on tuition fees;
 - c. No refund on book fees.

II. GENERAL RULES ON ACADEMICS

A. Grading System (Classroom Assessment)

1. The school's grading system is based from the DepEd Order #8, series 2015.

2. Students/pupils are graded on **WRITTEN OUTPUT, PERFORMANCE TASKS & QUARTERLY ASSESSMENT** every quarter.
3. Admin Evaluation may be conducted anytime as part of the final grade in a particular grading period.

B. Selection of Honors / Medals

Honors:

1. Candidates for honors, at any grade/year level shall be drawn from the qualified pupils/students.
2. They must have an average grade of at least 89.50% or any value rounded off to 90% and a passing final grade in all learning areas. And they will be ranked by class.
3. The pupils/students' grade in the previous curriculum level shall not be considered in the ranking of honor pupils/students.
4. Only the grades in the current curriculum year shall be considered in the ranking of honors.
5. Transferees shall be considered in the ranking provided they are enrolled not later than the second week of classes of the current year.
6. The final rating shall be computed to the three decimal places. In case of a tie, candidates shall be declared in the same honor ranking.
7. All candidates must be of good moral character and have not been subjected to any disciplinary actions within the current school year.

Subject and Co-Curricular Medals:

1. Achievements of pupils/students in specific academic disciplines and other co-curricular activities shall be given recognition.
2. For the selection of the academic medalist, a pupil/student who has won in a division/city level will be awarded. In the case that a student did not win in a city level, a selection panel shall deliberate the qualification of a candidate.
3. Subject medals are given to pupils/students who have the highest grade in a particular subject.
4. For the selection of the best in non-academic and co-curricular medalists, pupils/students who belong to the top five of a particular field at the end of the 4th quarter and as recommended by the adviser shall be qualified to undergo audition process by the school administrators. In case audition is not held due to unavoidable / reasonable circumstances, the school administrator/s may declare the student/pupil who won on any school competition and has shown outstanding performance in a particular field as recipient of the said award.
5. A student or pupil with perfect attendance shall also be recognized during the convocation. (Excuses subject the child from disqualification.)
6. All candidates must be of good moral character and have not been subjected to any disciplinary actions within the current school year.

C. Enhancement and Remedial Classes

1. All incoming Grade 12, Grade 10 and Grade 6 students and pupils are required to attend the enhancement classes during summer. This is to prepare the graduating students for the National Achievement Test and

other entrance examinations like the Philippine Science High School (PSHS) entrance exam. Furthermore, this enhancement classes are necessary to complete the 205 days of required classes. The graduating classes take their final exams 3 weeks ahead of the non-graduating classes.

2. All students and pupils with grades below 76 in any subjects at the end of the school year are required to attend remedial classes during summer.

III. CAMPUS BEHAVIOR

You are now a member of the Albert Einstein School community. As an Einsteinian, you are expected to behave as a decent person. Albert Einstein considers it important that certain rules of action be followed to facilitate better learning activities of students in search for the truth. Thus, your behavior reflects the quality of such training.

You should know how to conduct yourself in relation to objects, persons and groups of people. Such actuation is a manifestation of the degree of your involvement in the making of your environment.

1. Students should respect authority. The usual norms of politeness and etiquettes are to be followed when dealing with administrators, faculty members, office personnel, work force, fellow students and all campus visitors.
2. The Albert Einstein School prescribes a uniform. An Einsteinian wear a complete uniform from Monday thru Thursday (*see Section about Uniform*). On Fridays, students and pupils wear decent, casual / Sunday dress. The ID card must always be worn with any type of uniform.
3. Students should refrain from any form of indecent behavior.
4. Students must refrain from shouting, running or playing along the corridor especially during class hours. They are expected to show refinement and proper decorum anytime and anywhere.

5. Students and pupils are not allowed to stay in the classroom during recess time and noon break.
6. Students should refrain from bringing valuable items to school like iPods, laptops, video games and DSLR cameras.
7. Bringing of cellular phone is NOT ALLOWED in the school. In case of emergency, cellphones from the Business Office may be used. If a cellphone rings or students/ pupils are caught using their phones, the teacher or any school authority has the right to confiscate the phone and the parents will be notified.
8. Strict enforcement of order and cleanliness on campus should be observed. No littering is allowed. Chewing gum inside the school campus is strictly prohibited.
9. Smoking is NEVER ALLOWED inside the school premises at all times. The use of drugs and alcoholic drinks, vaping and gambling in the school are STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
10. For security and safety purposes, students and pupils are strictly prohibited from going out of school campus during recess time. Students are not allowed to hang around in public places during class hours.
11. During regular class days, all students are expected to be out of the campus by 5:30 pm. If necessary, special permission may be granted by the School Director/Principal for group activities which may go beyond the curfew time.
12. On regular classes, hair dye is NOT ALLOWED for both boys and girls. Hair dye, if necessary, will only be allowed on special occasions like as character make-up in a show, JS Prom, Christmas Party.

IV. ON PROCEDURES

1. School Uniform

- A. An Einsteinian wears a complete uniform from Monday to Thursday. The prescribed uniform for boys includes the prohibition from wearing earrings and

colored or printed undershirts. Only plain, white-colored undershirt is allowed. The Einstein proper haircut is two by three (2 x 3) inches. Haircut inspection is done every first Monday of the month.

- B. The prescribed uniform for girls includes the prohibition from wearing make – up (lipstick, eyeshadows, blush-ons, etc.) and nail polish and other outlandish accessories.
- C. On Fridays, students wear decent, casual / Sunday dress. Tattered jeans, sleeveless blouse, short pants should not be worn.
- D. The CAT uniform is worn during the scheduled OD work. The classes involved are Gr. 5, Gr. 6, Gr.7, Gr.8, Gr. 9 and Gr. 10.

E. Schedule of Uniform

Monday: Pearl uniform (light yellow & light blue)

Tuesday: yellow AES t-shirt

Wednesday: Vintage uniform (bright yellow & navy blue)

Thursday: blue AES t-shirt

Friday: casual / Sunday dress

Note: Mondays & Wednesdays – black shoes & white socks

Tuesdays & Thursdays – dark blue/black denim jeans, rubber shoes and socks

*wearing of jogger pants is NOT ALLOWED

- F. The school uniforms are not to be worn in such public places as movie houses. They may be worn off campus only by students/ pupils designated as official school representatives.

2. Definition of PERFECT ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

- A. present and on time for morning / afternoon assembly
- B. present and on time in all classes
- C. Students who were suspended and therefore did not attend class are not qualified for perfect attendance and punctuality
- D. Students who missed classes even if excused because of family matters are not qualified for perfect attendance and punctuality
- E. Students who fell ill and missed classes to rest in the clinic are not qualified for perfect attendance and punctuality

3. Policies on Absence during Exams/Quizzes

- A. The missed exam/quiz is taken in the office after assembly.
- B. A fee of P 50.00 per subject is paid at the Business Office
- C. The grade already transmuted will have a deduction of 10 pts.

4. Cleanliness and Care of School Property

- A. Every Einsteinian has the duty to keep the school campus, classroom, faculty lounge, laboratories, sinks, canteen, bleacher, corridors and comfort rooms clean.
- B. Put all trash inside the receptacles. Do not litter the grounds with papers, wrappers, plastics, empty bottles and other waste materials.
- C. Respect school properties. Do not vandalize/ destroy walls, chairs, tables, blackboards or any surface.
- D. Homeroom cleaning time is at 4:30-5:00 under the supervision of the classroom adviser.

5. Strenuous Games

- A. Strenuous games such as basketball and running are strictly prohibited before morning and afternoon assemblies and during recess time.
- B. Playing is only allowed at 11:30-12:30 & 4:30-5:30 pm.

6. Recess Time

During recess time, students and pupils are strictly prohibited from going out of the campus.

V. OTHER MATTERS

1. Transactions in the Business Office are from 7:30 – 11:30 AM and from 1:00 – 5:00 PM ONLY.
2. Consultations/clarifications addressed to school personnel regarding school matters must be from 5:00 – 6:00 PM ONLY.
3. Only one (1) parent/ guardian / “yaya” per child (Nursery – Gr.1 pupils) is allowed to stay in the designated area assigned by the school administrators. Those who are allowed to stay must wear their ID at all times and wear decent attire. ***SLEEVELESS BLOUSE, SHORT PANTS, TATTERED JEANS and SLIPPERS are NOT ALLOWED.***
4. Parents, guardians or “yayas” who stay in the designated areas must be responsible for the cleanliness and orderliness of the areas.
5. Family security guards / escorts are NOT ALLOWED inside the school campus.
6. Parking in front of the gate is prohibited. It will only cause traffic and problem to everyone.
7. The gate is locked at all times. The security guard opens the gate at 11:00 AM (Kin-Grade 4), 11:30 AM (Grade 5-10) and at 4:35 PM (all levels). If there is an

urgency to see the student / pupil, the security guard asks that person to log in for identification. Parents/ Guardians are also asked to cooperate in this regard.

8. In every school activity or school competition, the decision of the board of judges is FINAL and IRREVOCABLE.
9. School activities must always be under the supervision of the school authorities. Parents /Guardians must not in any way involve themselves, get emotionally affected and turn out to confront / assault the students. The proper way is to meet and have a dialogue with the Director / Principal and the Homeroom Adviser of the particular student/s.
10. Report cards are issued after every grading period. Parents will be informed to come personally to get the report card of their children and attend the regular Homeroom PTA meetings. Periodic warnings are also sent to the parents when necessary to inform them of their children's disciplinary records.

Parents should respond to the letters or phone calls by a personal visit to the Office of the Director or Principal. A close cooperation between the school authorities and the parents is considered of utmost importance in the formation and education of the students.

VI. DISCIPLINARY PENALTIES

1. Penalties are imposed for violations of the rules and regulations of the school to:
 - a. teach the ideals of justice;
 - b. correct and strengthen the character of the students;
 - c. safeguard the order necessary for a good learning atmosphere;
 - d. to deter the students from violating rules; and
 - e. safeguard other students from the possible harm and bad influence of the law breaker.
2. The school reserves the right to determine the sanction on a misbehavior committed by the students. Parents/ Guardians concerned shall be notified accordingly.

3. No sanction shall be imposed upon any student except for cause and only after due investigation.

VII. SANCTIONS

A. CLEANING of the SCHOOL CAMPUS (1 period)

Cleaning of school campus is done and recorded for minor violations and is done for the following offenses:

1. tardiness
2. noise in going from one area to another (like from the classroom to the computer room, AVR, Science laboratory)
3. unexcused absences from the class or any school activity (no excuse letter)
4. no ID
5. going to other floor levels
6. getting inside other classrooms
7. leaving books, notebooks and other school materials in the classroom after dismissal time
8. disturbances/ noise in the formation line during assemblies
9. littering
10. hiding valuable properties of others such as watches, bags etc.

B. STANDING

The student will be made to stand for half day outside of the administration office (with a break for one period). Parents will be informed of the student / pupil's infraction.

1. bringing / playing cards and other gambling paraphernalia such as magic card, basketball cards and the like. (Such game materials will be confiscated, and the parents will be informed.)
2. incomplete uniform
3. bringing of valuable items to school such as cellular phones, iPods, laptops, video games and DSLR cameras (*A fine of P300.00 will be imposed*)
4. chewing gum inside the campus or eating inside the classroom during class hours.
5. failure to claim the report card one week after the convocation (*A fine of P100.00 will be imposed*)
6. failure to return the report card duly signed by the parents three days after the card was claimed
7. cursing, uttering foul language, making dirty / vulgar signs
8. violations on the provisions on school uniforms which include any of the following:
 - a. wearing of earrings by boys inside the school campus
 - b. wearing of colored nail polish, make – up
 - c. wearing of printed/ colored undershirts
 - d. wearing of shirts/ mid-rib blouses with vulgar designs
 - e. wearing of shorts, sleeveless shirts, micro-mini skirts, hanging shirts/blouses, tattered jeans
 - f. wearing of unnecessary accessories/jewelry
 - g. hair dye (boys and girls) and incorrect haircut for the boys

C. SUSPENSION

Suspension is imposed for major infractions of the school rules and regulations. A student who will be suspended shall bring his/ her parent/ guardian for a conference with the Principal and Guidance Counselor.

He will serve his suspension by performing tasks or community service under the supervision of the Principal during a class day/s. Suspension will range from a minimum of one day to a maximum of 10 school days as determined by the Guidance Counselor or Principal.

EACH of the FOLLOWING OFFENSES will merit a SUSPENSION:

1. smoking, vaping, gambling in any form and bringing alcoholic drinks inside the campus
2. coming to school drunk or having taken an alcoholic drink
3. cutting classes
4. theft
5. bullying, fighting
6. misrepresentation in asking permission from parents regarding school activities
7. inflicting physical injury on others
8. possession of deadly weapons
9. extortion or asking money from others
10. deliberate destruction of school properties and properties of others (vandalism) (*A fine will be imposed basing from the materials and labor costs of replacement*)
11. bringing / circulating pornographic materials and opening pornographic websites
12. engaging in public display of affection like kissing, smooching, petting, necking, embracing, being physically “too close “for comfort and other indecent acts
13. cheating (The offender will get a one (1) day suspension, a grade of 50 on the examination where he cheated and a failing mark (70) in Conduct during that Grading period.

14. forgery, tampering with school records
15. threatening fellow students or any person
16. insubordination and disrespect to school staff, teachers and administrators
17. possession and/or exploding firecrackers in campus
18. destroying the reputation of others
19. inappropriate use of cellular phones by taking pictures of others without permission
20. falsification of documents
21. allowing others to use his/her ID and using the school ID of others
22. allowing outsiders, be they relative or friends, inside the campus without informing proper authorities
23. locking oneself in a room with another person for no valid reason
24. getting inside the restroom of the opposite sex

D. DISMISSAL

Dismissal is the heaviest penalty. A student who will be dismissed from Albert Einstein is never readmitted to the school. He / She will be dropped from its rolls and will be issued his/her transfer credentials. Dismissal is recommended by the Disciplinary Board when one of the following is committed:

1. accumulation of three (3) suspensions
2. shoplifting
3. taking part in rumbles
4. staging a strike, walkout and other mass activity which will cause disruption of school functions, classes and other activities

5. organizing or joining fraternities, groups and other movements not recognized by the school and taking part in initiation rites
6. possession and /or taking prohibited drugs like marijuana, shabu, ecstasy, heroin, cocaine, opium, LSD, inhalants and other prohibited substances
7. engaging in pre-marital sex
8. pregnancy, abortion
9. drug pushing
10. physical assault on any member of the school community

(Parents/guardians that inflict physical assault to any student will subject their child /ward for dismissal)

VIII. PROCEDURE FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

1. Minor cases of misconduct shall be handled by the subject teacher or the Homeroom Adviser.
2. Repeated infraction of minor cases of misconduct will be forwarded to the Guidance Counselor.
3. Serious cases shall be forwarded to the Office of the Principal.
4. The Principal will conduct the preliminary investigation right away.
5. After the investigation, the Principal will notify the parents.
6. The Principal determines the appropriate sanction.
7. Students who commit any of the offenses under dismissal should be deliberated by the Disciplinary Board.
8. The Disciplinary Board convenes and deliberates.
9. A simple majority is required to dismiss a student.

10. The Disciplinary Board informs the parents about the final decision.

IX. DISCIPLINARY PROBATION

A student who incurs one suspension or two suspensions is placed under disciplinary probation. However, if in a year he does not get suspended, he will start with a clean slate the following year.

X. RIGHT TO REPRESENT

Should a student feel that he has been treated unjustly by any member of the school community, he should present the matter to his Homeroom Adviser who will then present it to the Principal. The Principal will bring the matter to the Director of the school for appropriate action.

* There are ten presidents of the school's organizations and clubs, and each cast a vote.

The majority decision of each sector of the Disciplinary Board shall constitute as ONE VOICE.

ONLINE DISTANCE LEARNING (ODL)

ATTENDANCE POLICIES:

1. The boarding time in all classes is 5 minutes before the scheduled time.
2. A student/pupil who joins a class after 10 minutes is considered absent.
3. In case of internet connectivity and power interruption which restrain the child from attending online classes and joining the class on time, the parent/guardian may notify the school, the teacher or class adviser.
4. No auditing (sitting in) is allowed in any class.
5. Regular attendance in all classes and class activities is expected for all students and pupils.

ONLINE CLASSROOM POLICIES:

1. All students/pupils must initially turn their microphones on “mute” mode.
2. The student/pupil must wait for the teacher to allow him to turn on the microphone if he wants to ask question or wants to clarify something about the lesson.
3. Stay focused and be seated properly in the Learning Space prepared at home during the whole duration of the class.
4. Going to other websites that are not necessary for the class is not allowed.

5. Keep the links of the class privately. Sharing them to others outside of the class is strictly prohibited.
6. Be sure all the gadgets needed for the class are in good condition and prepared ahead of time.
7. All textbooks and other materials needed for the class must be always at the reach of the students and pupils.
8. Eating or chewing of gum is not allowed during a class session.
9. Taking photos during classes if not necessary and without proper permission from the subject/person is **STRICTLY NOT ALLOWED**.
10. The school implements a 3-day online classes in a week. The Online Classes are scheduled on Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays. Tuesdays and Thursdays are set for parents/students' consultation with teachers and other school personnel on school matters.
11. In the event that holidays fall on MWF, makeup classes are going to be held. This is to suffice the number of school days DepEd has required under DepEd Order # 029.
12. Makeup classes are also held if online classes are disrupted due to internet connection and power interruptions.

DRESS CODE AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS:

1. All students/pupils are expected to be wearing the prescribed uniform during class hours.

Monday : NEW yellow AES t-shirt, pants

Wednesday : NEW blue AES t-shirt, pants

Friday : casual / Sunday dress

2. Strictly sleeveless shirts, shirts with vulgar designs are not allowed.
3. The prescribed uniform for girls include the prohibition from wearing make-up (lipstick, eyeshadows, blush-ons) and other outlandish accessories.
4. Proper haircut for boys is also encouraged even during this pandemic.

PARENTS' / GUARDIANS' ROLES:

1. Parents' primary role in the Online Enhancement Program of the school is support system and supervision at home especially on their children's attendance in all the class sessions.
2. They may assist in the preparation of the gadgets needed to be sure their children are ready for the class.
3. Parents or guardians must be always available for HR Meetings/Virtual Meetings if called upon by the school.
4. Report cards are issued after every grading period. Parents will be informed to come personally to get the report card of their

children. Periodic warnings are also sent to the parents when necessary to inform them of their children’s disciplinary records.

- 5 Parents should respond to the letters or phone calls for a personal visit to the Office of the Director or Principal if necessary. A close cooperation between the school authorities and the parents is considered of utmost importance in the formation and education of the students.

GRADING SYSTEM:

The school follows the INTERIM POLICY GUIDELINES FOR ASSESSMENT AND GRADING in light of the Basic Learning Continuity Plan (DepEd Order #31) as mandated.

To evaluate student learning at particular points in each quarter, summative assessments shall continue in the form of WRITTEN WORKS AND PERFORMANCE TASKS.

- A. Written works shall be administered to assess essential knowledge and understanding through Unit Tests/Periodical Test
- B. Performance Tasks allow learners to show what they know and are able to do in diverse ways. They may create or innovate products or do performance-based tasks including skill demonstrations, group presentations, oral work, multimedia presentations, and research projects. It is important to note that written outputs may also be considered as performance tasks (DepEd 2015, pp. 7-8), examples daily /weekly drills, performances, activities, participation

in the class. Book activities and drills are part of the PT which are to be checked quarterly.
